 **Lure Operator, Equipment and Course Description** 

- Lure Operator--Shannon Dumas, 316 Charis Dr., Stonewall, LA 71078. (lure operators may be substituted as necessary)
- Battery-powered or gas-powered continuous loop or drag equipment will be used.
- Lures consist of plastic bags.
- Electronic timing system will be used, with manual timing as a backup if needed.
- The course will be on a natural (grass) surface.
- The Fast CAT running lane will be enclosed with temporary fencing, including the catch pen, which will be at least 40 yards long. The show site is not fenced.

All entries will be confirmed by email, please be sure your email is correct and legible.

Dogs may enter only once per event.

Entry Fees: Includes \$4.50 AKC Recording Fees

- \$25.00 for entries received before closing of advanced entries. (March 5, 2026, 6:00 pm)
- \$30.00 for entries received after closing of advanced entries and day of show entries. *Day of event entries will start at 8:00 am and close at 1:00 pm Friday and Saturday and 11:00 am on Sunday, and will be accepted as time permits*
- \$10.00 for "Fun Run." Fun Run entries will start at 8:00 am and close at 1:00 pm Friday and Saturday and 11:00 am on Sunday, and are accepted as time permits.
- \$1.00 non-refundable convenience fee per entry will be charged for all online and credit card entries.

- *\$35.00 fee for returned checks. Returned checks will not be redeposited.*
- Official Paper entry form is at the end of this Premium list.
- Each dog requires an entry form, either online or paper, with AKC "Agreement" signed by owner.
- Late, incomplete, unsigned, unpaid, or conditional entries, or entries not containing the "Agreement" found on the Official AKC Entry Form will not be accepted.
- Owners are responsible for the accuracy of the information required on the entry form. Changes, additions, or corrections to an entry, entry substitutions, or cancellations by the owner must be received in writing (email accepted) by the Event Secretary prior to the closing date of the test. Other means of notification will not be accepted. Errors on entries may lead to errors in results being submitted to AKC. It is the responsibility of the entrant to review the results and notify the Event Secretary via email

 **EVENT DAY PROCEDURES** 

Safety is of the utmost importance. It is the responsibility of the event committee to ensure the safety of the course, equipment and conduct of those involved with the event.

ROLL CALL and INSPECTIONS will start at 7:45 a.m. each day.

TEST HOURS: 8:00 am until completed or 3:00 p.m. whichever comes first.

LUNCH BREAK: 12.00-1:00 p.m.

PRIORITY RUNS WILL BE FOR ADVANCED ENTRIES. Same day entries and fun runs will be worked in beginning after 9:00 each day (earlier if there is little wait).

Each dog will be inspected before each run by the inspection Committee for lameness, fitness to compete, and females in season. All dogs to be inspected must be presented without tape, bandages, or wrapping/coverings of any kind (coats, blankets, etc.). If, in the opinion of the inspection committee a dog is found to be lame, unfit to compete, or in season, the dog will not be allowed to test, and the applicable entry fees, minus convenience fees, will be refunded.

Dogs will be brought to the start line only after it is confirmed that the catcher is ready at the catch pen. Priority will be given to dogs whose catchers are ready.

Event staff dogs will run prior to morning roll call and at the end of day and/or worked in as needed.

There will be concurrent runs, but dogs must rest at least fifteen minutes between runs. Priority will be given to dogs that have not run over those who have run once.

By AKC rule, The Huntmaster is in charge of all dogs and handlers on the field. They shall ensure handlers understand safe release and retrieval procedures, the lure is properly positioned, the lure operator, timers and starting line signal person are ready and shall signal the lure operator to start the lure and then give the verbal signal "Tally Ho" for the handler to release the dog. DO NOT release your dog prior to or hold your dog after the "Tally Ho" is given!

 **Awards, Ribbons and Rosettes** 

A light blue flat ribbon will be awarded to any dog who achieves a qualifying run.

A special Rosette will be awarded to any dog who earns a title. Please indicate on your entry form if you expect to earn a title. (in the event there are not enough title rosettes, one will be obtained and mailed to the exhibitor)

A flat ribbon will be available for any dog who completes a "fun run"

Fast CAT Basics

The Fast CAT is a timed straight race of 100 yards where a dog chases a lure. Dogs run singularly and earn points based on their handicapped speed. There are no placements. Titles are issued at designated benchmarks. The dog's time to complete the 100-yard dash is converted into MPH. (MPH = 204.545/time) Dogs earn points based on their handicapped speed.

A handicap system is applied to a dog's MPH to determine the number of points earned. The handicap system is based on the height of the dog at its withers:

- 18" or greater = handicap is 1.0
- 12" up to less than 18" = handicap is 1.5
- Below 12" = handicap is 2.0

Points = MPH multiplied by the dog's handicap. Fast CAT suffix titles are earned at designated milestones:

- BCAT = 150 points
- DCAT = 500 points
- FCAT = 1,000 points
- FCAT# = every additional 500 points

The AKC Fast CAT website will feature the Top 20 Fastest Dogs by Breed by Year national standings. The standings will be updated as event results are processed. (https://www.apps.akc.org/apps/fastcat_ranking/)

Guidelines for Handlers

- **ALL DOGS RUN AT THE SOLE RISK OF THE OWNER.**
- Coursing is an athletic activity that can tax a dog's physical strength. Dogs that are overweight and/or out of condition may be at greater risk for injury and exhaustion. The inspection committee has the authority to disallow a dog's entry into a test, and in such instances, applicable entry fees will be refunded.
- It is strongly recommended that prior to running your dog, you have good "recall" control, as the dogs will be off leash.
- Handlers are advised to warm up their dogs prior to their run and walk them for 5-10 minutes afterwards.
- Dogs will be brought to the start line on leash and released upon a verbal signal ("Tally-Ho!") from the huntmaster. The huntmaster is responsible for field safety and therefore is in complete charge of all dogs and handlers on the field. In service to this responsibility, he/she has the authority to stop the lure in any potentially dangerous situation and signal the handler to retrieve their dog.
- Handlers are not allowed to walk down the Fast CAT course before an official run.
- The handler may NOT run down the course to entice the dog to run or use toys/treats to get the dog to run. They CAN call their dog from the catch area. Handlers may carry toys or treats on their persons to assist with retrieving their dogs at the completion of their run. Please review the published AKC rules pertaining to Fast CAT.
- If the dog eliminates on the field during the course, this will be considered a non-qualifying run.
- It is required that handlers have someone familiar with the dog at the end of the course to catch the dog or have someone else release their dog at the start line. Handlers are expected to promptly secure the dog and leave the field with the dog on leash. Dogs that delay the event because their owners cannot recall them may be refused entry at future events.
- Recalls back to the start line are NOT allowed. Handlers are allowed to call the dog from the catch area. Toys or treats may be used to help catch the dog but must be concealed until the dog crosses the finish line.

- Exhibitors should follow their veterinarian's recommendation to ensure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations.
- **HANDLERS ARE EXPECTED TO CLEAN UP AFTER THEMSELVES AND THEIR DOGS. FAILURE TO DO SO MAY RESULT IN HANDLER BEING ASKED TO LEAVE THE SHOW SITE. ENTRY FEES WILL NOT BE REFUNDED. POOP BAGS ARE AVAILABLE AT THE INSPECTION TABLE. KEEP A BAG IN YOUR POCKET AND PUT IT IN THE TRASH CONTAINERS AFTER USE.**

 **Miscellaneous** 

- **BARK Agility Club of Central MS, Jackson Obedience Training Club and the City of Richland Directors, Agents, Superintendents & Employees are not responsible for loss or damage to, or death of any dogs at these events or for the possessions of any participant, whether the result of an accident or any other cause. It is expressly understood that every dog at this show is in the care, custody and control of the owner or handler during the entire time the dog is on the show premises.**
- Open to all dogs at least 12 months of age that are individually registered/listed with the AKC. This includes dogs recorded in the FSS program, dogs with PAL numbers or dogs enrolled in the AKC Canine Partners program. (An event number defines an event.)
- **Aggressive dogs are not allowed to participate or be on the event grounds. Dogs that exhibit aggressive behavior towards people or other dogs, will be removed from the site at the discretion on the event committee.**
- We will break periodically to accommodate workers and allow for lunch.
- Event is held in rain-or-shine, outdoor event. Please plan accordingly.
- All dogs **MUST** be on a short leash of 6 ft in length or less or confined to a crate and under control while on the test grounds, except during their runs. Retractable leads **ARE NOT** allowed onsite.
- Handlers should wear comfortable shoes and be physically able to hold and release their dogs, as well as catch them.
- Any person, upon reasonable complaint, may be asked to leave the grounds of the test by the Event Committee and may be disciplined by the AKC. Children must always be under control of their parents or guardian(s).
- **No entry fees will be refunded if the event cannot be started or completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, extreme and/or dangerous weather conditions, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, strikes or any other cause beyond the control of the Club or its members and representatives.**
- Dogs may wear any collar except a choker collar, a collar with prongs, or an electronic training collar. The collar should be snug to minimize the chances of getting hung on something during the run. The event committee may, at its discretion, require removal of tags (or securing with tape) to ensure the dog's safety. Owners may use clips or rubber bands to hold the dog's hair. The owner assumes responsibility for the safety of the dog with regard to the dog's collar and paraphernalia. Harnesses or head halters may be used on the grounds but must not be worn while running the course.
- Entry Fees will not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent. After the closing date, refunds for any cause are at the discretion of the event committee.
- The Event Committee reserves the right to remove any dog in distress in a parked vehicle or crate.
- There will be portable toilets on the site for your use.
- There is no shade or water at the show site, please feel free to bring Canopies, ice chests etc.
